ORDINANCE NO. 21-125

AMEND THE GRANTS BUDGET:

APPROPRIATE \$511,255.44 FROM THE STATE OF DELAWARE DEPARTMENT OF SAFETY AND HOMELAND SECURITY TO THE FY2022 FUND TO COMBAT VIOLENT CRIME GRANT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, DIVISION OF POLICE

WHEREAS, funding has been awarded from the State of Delaware, Department of Safety and Homeland Security to the FY2022 Fund to Combat Violent Crime Grant; and

WHEREAS, the funding will be used by the New Castle County Department of Public Safety, Division of Police for overtime patrols in high crime areas, specialized training, purchase of essential police equipment and confidential special investigations; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive has determined that grants received will be sufficient to cover the increase in the Grants Budget as hereinafter amended; and

WHEREAS, Council has determined that the provisions of this Ordinance substantially advance, and are reasonably and rationally related to, legitimate government interests (i.e., promoting the health, safety, morals, convenience, order prosperity and/or welfare of the present and future inhabitants of this State).

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY OF NEW CASTLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Grants Budget as adopted by Ordinance No. 75-173 is hereby amended by adding the material on the attached Exhibit "A," which is considered to be underscored in its entirety, attached hereto and made a part thereof.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by County Council and approval by the County Executive, or as otherwise provided in 9 *Del. C.* § 1156.

Section 3. It is the intent of the County Council that the provisions of this Ordinance shall be effective retroactive to September 7, 2021.

SYNOPSIS: This Ordinance, if approved, will appropriate \$511,255.44 from the State of Delaware Department of Safety and Homeland Security to the FY2022 Fund to Combat Violent Crime Grant. The funding will be used by the New Castle County Department of Public Safety, Division of Police for overtime patrols in high crime areas, specialized training, purchase of essential police equipment and confidential special investigations.

It is the intent of the County Council that the provisions of this Ordinance shall be effective retroactive to September 7, 2021.

FISCAL NOTE: The fiscal impact of this Ordinance, if approved, will be an increase in the authorized spending authority of the Grants Budget of \$511,255.44. This increase will impact FY2022 and FY2023 since the targeted program completion date is September 30, 2022. In addition, New Castle County is providing a cash match within the Department of Public Safety, Division of Police of \$127,150.64 to cover the full costs of employee benefits.

There will be no fiscal impact beyond FY2023 as a result of this grant award.

AMEND THE FY2022 APPROVED OPERATING BUDGET: APPROPRIATE \$19,870 IN FUNDING RECEIVED FROM THE RECORDER OF DEEDS TECHNOLOGY FEE ACCOUNT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, DIVISION OF POLICE EQUIPMENT BUDGET LINE ITEM

WHEREAS, this legislation will amend the FY2022 Approved Operating Budget by appropriating \$19,870 in funding received from the Recorder of Deeds Technology Fee Account to the Department of Public Safety, Division of Police Equipment Budget Line Item; and

WHEREAS, the State of Delaware provided New Castle County Police with pole cameras for various neighborhoods with problem areas; and

WHEREAS, these additional cameras require additional video storage capacity; and

WHEREAS, these funds will assist in the purchase of a 16 Bay Tower Evidence Recorder to record digital images from police cameras located in various neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the revenue measures heretofore adopted by the County Council are, in the opinion of the County Executive, estimated to yield sums at least sufficient to balance the proposed expenditures as set forth in the Annual Operating Budget as hereinafter amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY OF NEW CASTLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Annual Operating Budget Ordinance for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 is hereby amended by deleting the material stricken and adding the material underscored on the attached Exhibit "A."

Section 2. The foregoing amendment shall be considered a part of the Annual Operating Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 and shall be effective retroactively as though incorporated initially in the Annual Operating Budget Ordinance.

Section 3. The provisions in this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by County Council and approval by the County Executive, or as otherwise provided in 9 *Del. C.* § 1156.

SYNOPSIS: Amend the FY2022 Approved Operating Budget by appropriating \$19,870 in funding received from the Recorder of Deeds Technology Fee Account to the Department of Public Safety, Division of Police Equipment Budget Line Item to assist in the purchase of a 16 Bay Tower Evidence Recorder to record digital images from police cameras located in various neighborhoods.

FISCAL NOTE: This Ordinance, if approved, will amend the FY2022 Approved Operating Budget by appropriating \$19,870 in funding received from the Recorder of Deeds Technology Fee Account to the Department of Public Safety, Division of Police Equipment Budget Line Item.

The revised FY2022 Approved Operating Budget will be \$314,127,530. There is no discernible fiscal impact as this is a one-time equipment purchase in FY2022 with no service agreement. There is no discernible fiscal impact to FY2023 and FY2024.

The balance in the Recorder of Deeds Technology Fee Account as of October 13, 2021 is \$406,023.68. The revised balance in the Recorder of Deeds Technology Fee Account after this appropriation of funding will be \$386,153.68.
